Dog Licenses

In accordance with the North Bonneville City Code 6.04.005 all dogs over 6 months old need to be licensed. The cost of the license is \$3.00 per dog. Once the dog is registered the owner will receive an individual tag. This will help identify the dog if he/she becomes lost.

Business License

In accordance with the North Bonneville City Code 5.04 - each person (company) engaging in any business activity shall register with the city. The cost of the license is \$25.00 per year. Once a business license is purchased, the business will be placed on the North Bonneville Business Roster. We have many individuals coming into city hall requesting various services and they will be now be offered an updated copy of the City's Business Roster.

Golf Cart License

Every golf cart used in City Limits needs to be registered with the city. So stop in and fill out the registration form. The cost of the license is \$20.00.
