From the Mayor's Desk

New Treatment Plant on the way...

On September 6, 2009 the city submitted a grant application to the Washington State Public Works Board. This grant was offered to projects that are "shovel ready" and ones that would create jobs for small communities in rural counties. The total amount available for projects was \$9.5 million. Mary Hanson, Ray Hays, Engineer Ron Bush and HDR Engineering immediately jumped on the opportunity and completed the grant application. On November 3, 2009 the city received a call from the Public Works Board stating that there were 211 projects submitted on this grant and the city's application was ranked #1 for funding out of the 211 projects. The Public Works Board has approved the city's wastewater treatment plant project for funding in the amount of \$2.2 million. With this grant and \$200,000 matching funds from the city, we will be able to construct our new treatment plant and have it completed in 2010. Your city staff has been working long and hard to acquire funding for the new plant. It was a blessing to the city that the entire new facility will be paid for through grant funding at no cost to the citizens. Please be sure to pass on your thanks to city staff for a job well done. We will keep you updated as the new construction progresses.




