Public Comments

- Jane Jackson – Brought up the possibility of having recycle locations for aluminum cans to raise funds for the Fire Department
- Dave Bitikofer – Concerned about the heavy truck traffic on East Cascade Dr. and the amount of damage being done to the road
- Cheryl Jermann – Questioned why there was \$50,000 in the budget for a trail linkage to Beacon Rock

Councilmember Comments

- C. Randall – Concerned about trucks going too fast on East Cascade Dr. Agreed on the possible ability to recycle in the city.
- C. Lee – Agreed with C. Randall on items and stated that we could contact Farwest Crushing about the truck issues and that they have worked well with the city on these issues.

Mayor's Comments

- Mayor stated that the City Public Works Department had received a Performance Award from the Washington State Department of Ecology. The city has received the award for many years now and we should be proud of the department.

City Attorney's Report

- The city attorney reported that he had attended a conference regarding updating of city codes and other legal issues.

Unfinished Business

- Resolution 504 amending Resolution 501 Exhibits "B" Water Fees and "C" Sewer Fees. Council reviewed the resolution and a motion was made to amend the proposed resolution: deletion of the last three paragraphs on page 3 that were proposed for addition; amend the sewer base rate proposed to \$40.00 per month; add "water" before the meter size chart on pages 2 & 5.

- Ordinance 1083 amending Code Sections 13.04 Water and 13.12 Sewer. Council reviewed the ordinance proposed to have the code sections match resolutions previously passed by the council.

- Irene Bitikofer presented her letter to the council requesting adjustments to her water/sewer bills for 60 Look-In Lane relating to errors in billing.

- Ordinance 1086 amending Code Chapter 8.32 Outdoor Burning. Council reviewed the ordinance and a motion was made to amend the proposed ordinance: add the word “/her” to his on section 8.32.030 B; add \$5.00 to burn permit fee on 8.32.030.

Closing Public Comments

- Cheryl Jermann – Reported that there was a group meeting on a possible proposal to the city for use of the tourism funds to locate a facility in North Bonneville. Invited involvement. Also concerned about the groups using the disc golf course without paying and garbage, etc.
- Jane Jackson – Asked if fire pits in the RV Park needed a burning permit. The mayor stated no.
- Robert Miller – Concerns about cleanup after disc golf tournaments.
- Cheryl Jermann – Announced the Fire Department Turkey Bingo will be November 16.

Closing Council Comments

- C. Randall thanked everyone for coming and staying involved in city matters.
- C. Norris stated he was in favor of the fees for burning and that groups should pay per code for use of the disc golf course in the park.
- C. Whitcomb agreed that groups should pay for use of disc golf course.
- C. Lee stated only groups should pay for use of the disc golf course not individuals.
- C. Sabo stated that the Chevron did get a boost in business from the disc golf tournament that was held last weekend. He also reminded everyone that a group of disc golfers who came to town last winter for a tournament found all the ice storm damage and instead of playing disc golf they helped clean up and pile downed branches along the pathways and roads for Public Works to pick up. Additionally, he said the city should look into a reduction in the base rate for “snow birds” on months they are not residing in the city.
- Mayor Stevens also stated that the service station did a lot more business because of the disc golf and that the garbage left was no more than usual.
