There is not currently a burn ban, but please refrain when the wind is blowing! Be sure to practice good safety measures to protect us all! Come to City Hall for your permit, only \$5!

FROZEN PIPE TIPS

- **THE MOST VULNERABLE PIPES** are those exposed to severe cold — water-sprinkler lines and pipes in unheated interiors such as basements, attics, crawl spaces and areas where pipes are on exterior walls.
- **PREVENT FREEZING** by adding insulation around pipes and possibly installing insulating pipe sleeves or heat tape on exposed water pipes. Newspapers can be used for some insulation.
- **KEEP CABINET DOORS OPEN** and, if necessary, allow cold water to drip from faucets.

TO THAW FROZEN PIPES, use an electric heating pad, hair dryer or towels soaked in hot water.

SET THE HEAT AT 55 DEGREES OR HIGHER if you are leaving for an extended period.
