

**CITY OF NORTH BONNEVILLE  
ORDINANCE NUMBER 1118**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF NORTH BONNEVILLE, WASHINGTON, AMENDING  
NORTH BONNEVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 10.12 PARKING.**

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to chapter 35A.11 RCW, the City is duly authorized to regulate parking on public streets, right-of-ways and municipal parking lots as an exercise of the City's police power for the health, safety and welfare of its residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of North Bonneville has deemed it necessary and desirable to regulate parking in public areas to protect the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the Council now desires to amend Chapter 10.12.030 of the NBMC to clarify which vehicles have overnight parking restrictions.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, The City Council of the City of North Bonneville does hereby ordain as follows:

**Section 1.**

**Amend Chapter 10.12 Parking as follows:**

Chapter 10.12 PARKING

Sections:

10.12.030 Parking restricted.

A. No person having control over a vehicle, may park such vehicle upon any right of way, street, access road, municipal parking lot, ~~or~~ and leave such vehicle ~~in the same public place~~ overnight. Exceptions to the overnight parking are any vehicles which are permitted in accordance with Section 10.12.040.

B. In addition to the Washington Model Traffic Ordinance adopted by Chapter 10.04, no person may park or leave any vehicle, whether attended or unattended, upon the traveled portion of the roadway in such a manner as to block or obstruct the flow of vehicular traffic.

C. It is unlawful for the operator of a vehicle to leave the vehicle unattended within the limits of the roadway unless the operator of the vehicle arranges for the prompt removal of the vehicle.

D. No vehicle shall be parked on any street or marked stalls during snowstorms in such a manner as to impede removal of snow accumulation. Vehicles found to be impeding snow removal will be subject to impoundment.

**Section 2.**

**Severability.**

If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance.

**Section 3.**

**Effective Date and Publication.**

This Ordinance shall be effective five days after publication of the Ordinance, or a summary thereof consisting of its title, in the official newspaper of the City.


