**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BONNEVILLE,
WASHINGTON AFFIRMING SUPPORT FOR THE FEDERAL FAIR HOUSING ACT**

WHEREAS, the City of North Bonneville [City] has received a Community Development Block Grant and is required to comply with its provisions; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of North Bonneville believe it is in the City's best interest to affirm its support for the Federal Fair Housing Act and its provisions.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTH BONNEVILLE, WASHINGTON THAT DISCRIMINATION IN THE SALE, RENTAL, LEASING, FINANCING OF HOUSING OR LAND TO BE USED FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF HOUSING, OR IN THE PROVISION OF BROKERAGE SERVICES BECAUSE OF RACE, COLOR, RELIGION, NATIONAL ORIGIN, HANDICAPPED OR FAMILIAL STATUS, IS PROHIBITED BY THE FEDERAL FAIR HOUSING ACT

It is the policy of the City to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, handicapped or familial status.


Within its resource capacity the City will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, handicapped or familial status to seek equity under federal and state laws by filing a complaint with the Washington Human Rights Commission or the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Seattle Regional Office Compliance Division.

The City shall publicize this Resolution and through this publicity shall cause owners of real estate, developers and builders, to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Federal Fair Housing Law and any applicable state or local laws or ordinances.

The Mayor and Council of the City of North Bonneville requests staff print and distribute applicable fair housing information through local media and community contacts. And further requests that fair housing information be distributed through posters, flyers and any other means which will bring the attention of those affected, the knowledge of their respective responsibilities and rights concerning equal opportunity in housing.
