

**City of North Bonneville
Resolution Number 508**

A Resolution of the City of North Bonneville, Declaring Special Market Conditions Under RCW 39.04.280(1)(B) to purchase a used pumper tender / tanker truck.

Whereas, the City of North Bonneville is a Washington Municipality as defined in RCW 39.04.101; and

Whereas, the City maintains fire trucks and equipment used by the North Bonneville Fire Department for emergency response; and

Whereas, the City of North Bonneville Fire Department has need for a pumper tender / tanker truck to adequately address emergency response in the portions of the city that are not serviced by fire hydrants; and


Whereas, the City has an opportunity to purchase a used 1981 Ford F700 Tanker Truck and the seller, Earnest Lee Pound, is willing to sell the truck for \$8,500; and

Whereas, the cost of similar models of used tanker trucks of comparable condition including age, mileage, accessory equipment and amount of usage appear to be between \$14,000 to \$18,000 and are in other areas that would require shipping at an additional cost; and

Whereas, this resolution follows a voice vote at a regular city council meeting of February 27, 2018 authorizing the purchase, and this is to ratify and document the conditions of sale.


Now, therefore, be it resolved, the City Council of North Bonneville, Washington hereby declares a special market condition pursuant to RCW 39.04.280(1)(b) and ratifies the city council voice authorization of February 27, 2018 for the purchase of a 1981 Ford F700 Tanker Truck from the seller Earnest Lee Pound for a price of \$8,500 plus tax and license costs not to exceed \$1,500 for a total not to exceed \$10,000. The City Clerk is hereby directed to consummate the sale and the Mayor is authorized to sign any title documents necessary to complete the purchase and sale.


